"Change and decay in all around I see" (LSB 878:4)

Plants which died in the fall decay rapidly in spring. Human beings can die at any time of year, followed by our own decay. The ethical decay around us "stinks to high heaven." Our sinful nature is so decayed that "I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want, that I do" (Rom. 7:8).

But God provides the antidote to decay. Psalm 16:10 expresses our Christian hope: "You will not leave my soul for sheol; You will not allow Your Holy One to see decay." St. Paul (following St. Peter's Pentecost sermon) explained this: "David, after assisting with the plan of God in his own generation, fell asleep and was added to his fathers and saw decay. But He whom God raised [Jesus Christ] did not see decay. So, it should be known to you, brothers, that through Him forgiveness of sins is announced to you; and from all things from which you could not be justified in the law of Moses, in Him everyone who believes is justified" (Acts 13:36-39).

The sinless Son of God "died for our sins" (1 Cor. 15:3) "and was raised for our justification" (Rom. 4:25), so that "everyone who believe in Him would not perish but have eternal life" (John 3:16). "In Him we live and move and exist" (Acts 17:28). "Oh, Thou who changest not, abide with me!"

Whose Is It Anyway? If you have every bought or sold a house, you are acquainted with the concept of a "title search." Before you can sell your house, and before anyone else will feel comfortable putting down the money to buy it, you have to prove that you really own it. So a title company looks through the public records to ensure that you bought it from the person who really owned it, who bought it from the person who really owned it, all the way back to the earliest records of your state.

You can't understand the Seventh Commandment without understanding this concept of ownership or title. As the Small Catechism puts it: You shall not steal. What does this mean? We should fear and love God so that we do not take our neighbor's money or possessions, or get them in any dishonest way, but help him to improve and protect his possessions and income.

Your neighbor's possessions are his: you don't have a right to take them. And likewise, your possessions are yours. Ownership and property rights are foundational to any functioning society.

But there is something deeper to know about ownership, and that is the question of who has the title and ownership to you? Paul says, "Or do you not know that your body is a temple of the Holy Spirit within you, whom you have from God? You are not your own, for you were bought with a price" (1 Cor. 6:19–20).

If you yourself are owned by God, then of course everything that you own, you really only possess by God's leave: all of it belongs to Him since you belong to Him. For you were bought with the blood of Christ. This notion is the foundation of all Christian stewardship. It all belongs to God. It should all be used for things that bring honor to His name, blessings to our neighbors and the extension of His kingdom.

Christian Stewardship is the free and joyous activity of the child of God and God's family, the church, in managing life and all of life's resources for God's purposes. (LCMS definition)



Dollar for Missions (DFM) Update: After two months of 2024, CID has completed its first two DFM projects this year: 1) mileage money to support Pastor David Dunlop's Prison Ministry visits to Lincoln, Illinois every week (\$1,800) and 2) funding for St. John, Beardstown to purchase a few Spanish language hymnals (\$300). The current DFM project is for \$2,100 to provide Pastor Pablo Dominguez of Cristo Rey, East Moline honoraria as he conducts Spanish languages services and Bible classes in Beardstown twice a month for the second half of this year. The latest CID GatePost issue contains important information about decline in the District's capacity to continue supporting missions here and through the national Synod. Every CID congregation is receiving a letter from the District President, Chairman of the Board of Directors, Treasurer, and Financial Secretary on this important subject. Watch for it!

Council News: The treasurer's report indicated the general fund has \$52,321.08, and the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$21,459.58 for a total of \$73,780.66. There are approximately \$5,500.00 in outstanding bills to be paid. The church extension fund balance is \$134,085.27. An interest rebate check in the amount of \$1,684.94 was received from CID-CEF. Council approved using the rebate amount and \$715.06 from the general fund (brat profit) for a total of \$2,400.00 be applied to reduce our mortgage.

A thank you and monetary gift of \$100.00 was received from Redeemer Lutheran Church in appreciation for the extra bulletin covers and inserts that we provide them weekly. Faith has received \$2045.00 in memorials for Wayne Becker. We thank the Becker family for thinking about Faith. The family requests that this money and any additional dollars be applied to the mortgage. A \$10.00 check in memory of Yvonne Wegener was received from the Noards of Geneseo.

Trustee reported that one our furnaces might have an issue. He will try to see what might be wrong so he can set up a service call. No response yet on the elevator inspection. A company in Peoria has offered a free sound system assessment. They will be contacted for an appointment in April. The council agreed to renew our electric provider contract with Homefield Electric for two years. The energy price has gone up nearly 60% above previous years.

Q: Why does Paul say that "Love" is the greatest gift from God?

A: Paul concludes his 13th chapter of 1 Corinthians with these words, "Faith, hope, and love abide; but the greatest of these is love." All three are spiritual gifts from our loving God. It's by faith from the Holy Spirit that we know Christ as our Savior. Now, we live in the hope that we will live eternal with Christ. One day that faith will be sight as we see God with our own eyes, and our hope will be fulfillment. Jesus' return signals the end of faith and hope, but love never ends. God's love continues forever. "God is love, and whoever abides in love abides in God, and God abides in him." 1 John 4:16

Death was proof that Jesus was human, His resurrection was proof that He was God.
