Abba! Father! "Abba" is Aramaic and was a term of endearment, a more intimate term often used by children in the home. Our term "daddy" would be comparable. The idea that we finite, reprobate creatures could call the infinite, holy God "daddy" seems incomprehensible and blasphemous. So it would be were it not for our "adoption as sons." The Son of the Father took our place under the law and bore the curse of the law so that we might be called sons of the Father. Cleansed by His blood, declared holy by His Father, and filled with His Spirit we dare utter, "Abba! Father!" And because you are sons, God has sent the Spirit of his Son into our hearts, crying, 'Abba! Father!' (Galatians 4:4-6)

By God's grace we get to call God "daddy" and it's under our Daddy's love that we live our lives. We live under that love as we struggle with our sin, as we fail to live up to His expectations daily. Pentecost today is the celebration of something we have never witnessed in quite the same way as the first Christians. They had the noise of the great wind, the tongues of fire on the heads of the Apostles, and the speaking in tongues of that first Pentecost to mark the event. It is seven weeks from Easter, on the fiftieth day after Easter. On Pentecost, God fulfilled the promise to send the Holy Spirit in a way that was recognizable.

We do see the Holy Spirit poured out today. It happens in Baptism. We cannot see the Spirit, but He is being poured out with the water. We know it happens because Scripture says so. Our eyes can only see the water, but our trust in the Word of God shows us the Spirit, as God performs what He promised and creates faith in those who are "born of water and the Spirit," John 3:5. The sound of faithful preaching is the sound the Holy Spirit makes today to call men and women to faith and to eternal life in Christ Jesus. After all, "faith comes from hearing, and hearing by the word of Christ," Romans 10:17.

We celebrate Pentecost for the opportunity to learn and recall the truths demonstrated on that day. Modern life can confuse us and deceive us by hiding reality from us. We get caught up in that which is easily seen and heard and felt and tend to forget that reality is somewhat larger than what our senses can reveal to us. We celebrate the gift of the Holy Spirit to the Church to teach, lead, and guide her.

Celebrate with us at Faith Lutheran the Person and Work of the Holy Spirit, the Person of the Trinity on June 4th. Keep the Spirit within you alive and growing.

Discussion was held on the need to resurface our parking lot to preserve it from deterioration and get bids to do so.

July 4th Celebration brings carloads of people to our church to watch the Kewanee fireworks display. Once again, we have the opportunity to serve our community and evangelize at the same time. Central Illinois District's Response to the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation

2017 is the 500th anniversary of the Reformation and Martin Luther's posting of the 95 theses on the door of the Wittenberg's Castle Church. In the recent past, members of the CID-LCMS have been instrumental in rebuilding Wittenberg's Old Latin School and repurposing it into the International Lutheran Center. Additional support is needed for special 500th Anniversary programming at the Center. Tours, lectures, concerts, and socials will draw people from outside the Church to learn about Jesus, and salvation by grace, through faith in Him.

To meet those programing needs, a special appeal is being made to members of all CID congregations. Faith member's may donate through our congregation with a note on your check or envelope of **CID500**. We will have an opportunity to authorize an additional congregational gift at the July Voter's Assembly.

REFORMATION

Psalm 23 is the Shepherd Psalm. There we learn that the Lord is our shepherd. And since He is our shepherd, we will not want. We will not suffer want because the Lord, our shepherd, will lead us to green pastures and beside still waters. In other words, the Lord, our shepherd, will provide for all that we need in both body and soul.

Yet, we live as though this is not the case. We live as though we actually suffer from want, that the Lord, our shepherd, will not provide for all that we need. And thus, we live as though the Lord is not our shepherd. And that means that we live as though we are not the Lord's sheep.

How do we do this? We do it when we put anything else before Him and His provision for us. When we think that going to work is more important than receiving the gifts that He won for us on the cross, a violation of the First and Third Commandments. We do it when we fail to give generously of the first fruits of what the Lord has provided for us because we think we don't know what the future will bring, even though He has promised that He will lead us to green pastures and still waters. We do it when we think that the Lord is only in the business of helping those who will help themselves, we do this because we have a mind set on earthly, temporal things and not on heavenly, eternal things. We do this because we have stopped hearing the call of our shepherd, which comes through His Word.

The Word of God is how our shepherd calls us to himself. Through that Word, the Holy Spirit gathers and enlightens us with His gifts. Through that Word, we are kept holy and nourished in the one true faith, the faith that follows our Shepherd wherever He leads us. He promises to lead you to your true home, to the land flowing with milk and honey, to a better country, not of this world, but a heavenly one.

And so, here's the good news: The Lord is your shepherd still, even, and especially, for wayward sheep. For Jesus seeks and saves those who are lost. He finds the lost sheep and carries them back to the fold. He is the shepherd that lays down his life for His sheep. The Lord is your shepherd. Let us live then as His sheep.
