Controversial Conventions Contending for the Faith

We all know that the Christian faith is under attack by a world that is so often opposed to the teachings of Holy Scripture. However, enemies of Christ and His Word can also come from within, rather than outside the Church. False teachings spring forth which "pervert the grace of our God into sensuality and deny our only Master and Lord, Jesus Christ" (Jude 4). This is why the people of God - both individually as well as corporately - need to be diligent and contend for the faith. The verb that Jude uses is a strong one. It suggests not merely a friendly competition, but a fierce struggle, which can be painful. In fact, the root of the word in the original language is our English word agony.

A controversial church convention can be a living display of the graphic image St. Jude presents in these verses. Fifty years ago, in July of 1973, such a convention occurred in New Orleans as delegates from the LCMS met. For several years preceding the convention there had been concerns about how Scripture was being taught at Concordia Seminary, St. Louis. A majority of the faculty members were using the Historical-Critical method of Biblical Interpretation, which already had inroads in Europe and in mainline denominations in the United States. The premise of this method held that the Bible must be approached as any other book, and be subjected to critical analysis regarding its authorship, historicity and truth. Basically, this approach set aside Scripture's own claim to be the inspired, inerrant Word of God. Biblical narratives which claimed to be miraculous were interpreted to be fanciful exaggerations which were only meant to teach a moral lesson. When pressed, therefore, some of the professors of that day would assert that Adam and Eve need not be real, historical people, or that the miracles of Jesus did not really occur as Scripture described them.

The 1973 LCMS convention addressed the situation at the St. Louis Seminary. In a sad, but necessary judgment, the delegates asserted that the method of Biblical teaching at that time "cannot be tolerated in the Church of God." It was hoped that after the convention some sort of reconciliation could take place. But that did not occur. In February of 1974 a majority of students, and 40 of the 45 professors "walked out," and Seminex was founded. These events had a profound effect upon me as I began my undergraduate education in 1975, eventually enrolling at Concordia, St. Louis, where a new faculty, totally committed to the truth of Holy Scripture, had been formed.

As our Synod gathers again in convention this summer in Milwaukee and faces issues related to "Wokeism" in our Church's University System, we pray God's blessings on the delegates as they again "contend for the faith that was once for all delivered to the saints."



Voters' Assembly Notes: The semi-annual voters' meeting was held on July 9th. The first 6 month treasurer's report was distributed with Sue reporting that the general fund has \$53,125.42, the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$14,618.97 for a total of \$67,744.39. The church extension fund balance is \$144, 617.32. The first 6 month expenses exceeded income by \$751.05. The final invoice for the elevator repair has not yet been received. A \$250 memorial was given in honor of the Godke's 70th Wedding anniversary by Glen and Betty's family.

Membership changes included receiving infant son Maclin Talbot by Baptism, and releasing Mallery (Tudder) Pettis to St. Peter's-Kewanee.

Trustees reported the Rockford Insurance Company has been contacted, and has approved additional monies to repair the siding on the church. Israel Brothers Construction will be completing the siding and DeReu Roofing will be repairing the church and garage roof.

A motion was approved to have the piano tuned since it has been several years since the last time. Discussion was held on the public using our parking lot for recreational activities and the church's liabilities. Signage and security cameras were suggested, and these will be discussed with insurance carrier and the Council members.

This September a Bible Study "Call to Witness" will be offered giving information and tips to help spread the word and how to encourage family and inactive members back to church. This will possibly be held on Saturday mornings and led by Pastor Weber.

Question: Is there anything in scripture referring to the ages of the disciples and followers of Jesus?

Answer: The New Testament does not provide us with specific information regarding the age of the disciples of Jesus. In Jewish tradition the age 30 was regarded as the time of maturity and the minimum age for public teaching. Commentators sometimes point out, for example, that since the fishing business involved the kind of hard labor only younger men were able to endure, Peter and Andrew, James and John, were probably younger men in their 20s and 30s. Again, this is only guess work, so that we must be highly tentative regarding any conclusions that are drawn in this regard.
