God's First promise: *"I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; He will crush your head, and you will strike His heel."* (Genesis 3:15)

Did you know the first promise God ever made was about Christmas? In Genesis 3, we read that when Adam and Eve first sinned in the Garden of Eden, mankind was separated from God's presence. Sin robbed us of innocence and separated us from God. Because He is holy and perfect, God cannot be in relationship with sinners. This alienation broke God's heart because He loves us more than we could ever know. God formed a plan for our reconciliation with Him from the very beginning of human existence, and Jesus was going to be the essential part of the story.

That first Christmas, the birth of our Savior, marks the beginning of God's process to restore our relationship with Him through a New Covenant. The world waited thousands of years for God's promised Savior, and then, finally, He was here. This baby, who would forever defeat sin and death, became Immanuel, God with us. This the true hope for all Christians, and the Bible speaks of a hope that is an absolute certainty.

As we enter this Advent season, we should focus on the fulfillment of God's first promise, recognize that God is true to His Word, and meditate on the truth that He loves us so much that He sent His perfect Son to be born into a sinful world, to die and rise again, so that He could have a relationship with us.

Advent is a season of preparation in the Christian church. We are preparing to celebrate Jesus' coming as a baby in Bethlehem while also anticipating Christ's coming again to usher in the kingdom of God. Let's prepare to welcome Jesus together!

Here is an Advent prayer.

Lord Jesus, so often during this time of year we are tempted to not focus on you. We have so much to do, so much to prepare for, and the stress is often great. Remind us that in the end, our hope is not in the little things we do now. Our hope is in you, the perfect lamb of God, who was prophesied for hundreds of years and came exactly when you were supposed to. You were there before the world was created, you died on earth and came back to life, and sit at God the Father's right-hand today. Help us remember the inheritance we have as your followers, and that regardless of our circumstances, that inheritance does not change. Show us how to put our hope in you this day. We ask for these things in your name, Amen.

May you find peace and happiness during this wonderful season of boundless hope and throughout the new year. Thank you for everyone who served Faith in 2022, and may God richly bless you.

Church Council Report: The treasurer reported that the General Fund balance is \$48,971.41, the Memorial/ Dedicated Fund is \$15,340.51 for a total of \$64,311.92. The Church Extension Fund Balance is \$158,936.70. Chris Becker Memorials were \$105.00 designated for the mortgage.

Voters' Assembly is scheduled for January 8th after the worship service.

Council approved a contribution be made to Concordia-Geneseo's Academy for \$800 from Oktoberfest proceeds, and remainder to the repair of the elevator. Rockford Mutual Insurance will increase by \$50 /month.

Pastor will be attending a CID pastor's conference on January 7th in Farmersville, IL.

Council approved a food drive in Advent for the Kewanee Food Pantry. Poinsettia orders for Christmas services can be ordered until December 18th. A sign up list will be available in the Narthex.

Next scheduled meeting is December 15th to approve a 2023 budget and set a slate of officers for 2023.

2022 Operation Thankful is a program sponsored by Faith congregation this Advent season to assist the Kewanee Food Pantry. Members are encouraged to bring donations of non -perishable food items or dollars to worship services during this season. What a wonderful way for us to show our love for the fellow citizens in our community.

Q: What are swaddling cloths as mention in Luke 2:7 (And she gave birth to her firstborn son and wrapped him in swaddling cloths)?

A: Swaddling clothes are cloths and bands used in the practice of swaddling, or essentially "wrapping" an infant tightly in cloth. The idea behind swaddling is that it helps the baby transition from the womb (a very snug place) to the outside world. Swaddling clothes are still used today, but with some modifications. In general, swaddling has been proved to help infants sleep better, to prevent them from scratching themselves especially in a manger of straw or grass. When the Son of God came into our world, He was entrusted to responsible, loving parents who sought to meet His every need. Baby Jesus was wrapped in swaddling clothes according to the custom of the day, an action that showed the tender care and affection of His mother, Mary. The angel who spoke to the shepherds on the hillside mentions swaddling clothes as part of the sign to the shepherds that they had found the Messiah.
