**Advent** is the season of waiting and preparing for the coming of Christ both in the past as a human child, and also in the future as Christ Triumphant. As Israel waited for the first coming of the Savior, we wait and prepare for His second coming, which is the end of this world and Judgment Day.

Now most of us are waiting for Christmas, the finality of Advent. Advent is a time for repentant preparation of our hearts awaiting that festive celebration of the birth of our Savior. Unfortunately, we get kind of antsy about waiting and letting Advent be Advent. We must get the Christmas tree up and decorate the house inside and out. Don't forget the gift buying and parties. How easy it is to get caught up in the chaotic things to do and places to go. How hard it is for us to be patient and wait. If it's hard enough for us in the church to wait for Christmas, it's nearly impossible out there in the world with merchandise ads starting in October, and Christmas music playing in early November.

Often waiting can be fearful. We worry while waiting to hear from the doctor after lab tests and medical imaging. What will be the future of our finances as markets fluctuate and inflation rises? The people of Israel suffered for centuries in fear. Isaiah had warned them that God would allow their cities to be destroyed, but then God directs him to give them a hope of salvation. In Isaiah 12:2 we hear "Behold, God is my salvation; I will trust, and will not be afraid; for the Lord God is my strength and my song, and he has become my salvation." We get tired of all the hardship, heartache, and disappointment along the way. Sometimes we fearfully cry out, "How long, O Lord, how long?"

Waiting calls for patience. We need patience in order to wait and keep the faith and bear up under suffering and keep our eyes focused on the joy that lies before us. "Wait for the Lord; be strong, and let your heart take courage; wait for the Lord." Psalm 27:14 Waiting for the Lord is trusting Him above all things. Romans chapter five tells us that patient endurance is produced by suffering.

Of course suffering by itself doesn't give us hope. We need the encouragement of the Holy Scriptures. Suffering by itself only produces bitterness and anger as we can witness in the world around us. It is the encouragement of God's Word that we need to have this hope. We know a Savior, who went to the cross, who forgives our sins and promises us eternal life. And we know that our risen Lord is coming again to take us home and make everything right. The joy of eternal life which is set before us is what encourages us to patiently endure while we wait for Jesus to return. In the meantime we wait. The coming of the Lord is at hand, and the Lord is compassionate and merciful.

This Advent season wait and prepare. Be in the Word to strengthen your hope of salvation. Since Faith is <u>not</u> holding weekday Advent services, we strongly suggest you find an Advent daily devotion, and/or worship with another LCMS congregation in person, or via live streaming. Concordia-Geneseo and St. John-Geneseo will have three Wednesday Advent services starting at 7:00 PM, but will not be live streamed.


Wishing you a Blessed Christmas And Prosperous New Year

For 60 years the school has prepared students to maximize their spiritual, academic, physical, emotional, and social potential to become successful Christian members of society. This grant will help purchase two vans to transport high school students enrolled in the School-to-Work Internship Program and students taking classes at nearby Martin Luther High School. Thank you for your mites and your prayers for this Mission Grant.



Church Council Report: The treasurer reported that the General Fund balance is \$36,088.80, the Memorial/Dedicated Fund is \$18,939.57 for a total of \$55,028.37. The Church Extension Fund Balance is \$139,395.09. Glen and Betty Godke have donated \$3700 to upgrade the sound system for their 70 year anniversary.

The church insurance has increased by \$308/year. Budget needs and officer nominations are due in December.

**2023 Operation Thankful** is a program sponsored by Faith congregation this Advent season to assist the Kewanee Food Pantry. Members are encouraged to bring donations of non-perishable food items or dollars to worship services during this season. Soup and cereal is most needed at this time. This has been approved as a Thrivent Action project and \$250 has been received. This is a wonderful way for us to show our Christian love for the fellow citizens in our community.



A DOLLAR FOR MISSIONS UPDATE It is with exceedingly great joy that Central Illinois District President Rev. Michael Mohr announces that not only has our current Dollars for Missions Project (the purchase of a 15-passenger van for University Lutheran Church in Champaign) been fully funded, but July contributions towards Dollars for Missions have been robust enough to fully fund the next project on the list – Augment pay for Prison Ministry at Lincoln and Logan Correctional Centers. Therefore, our current Dollars for Missions Project is to raise \$20k for stipends to pastors to begin visiting four new prisons or jails in 2024. ### O: When was Jesus Christ born?

A: The Bible does not provide the exact day or even the exact year in which Jesus was born in Bethlehem. But a close examination of the chronological details of history narrows the possibilities to a reasonable window of time. Matthew 2:1 states that Jesus was born during the days of Herod the king. Since Herod died in 4 B.C. Further, Joseph and Mary fled Bethlehem with Jesus because Herod ordered all the boys 2 years old and younger in that vicinity killed. This indicates that Jesus could have been as old as 2 before Herod's death. Luke provides several other facts to ponder: "In those days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be registered. This was the first registration when Quirinius was governor of Syria." Quirinius governed Syria during this same time period, with records of a census that included Judea in approximately 6 B.C. This places the date of His birth between 6 and 4 B.C. The tradition of December 25 was developed long after the New Testament period. It's the day Christians have agreed to celebrate the birth of Jesus, but the exact day of His birth is unknown.
