Celebrating Epiphany

Epiphany, from the Greek word epiphaneia, means an appearance or manifestation. Christians celebrate this festival each year on January 6, the 12th day after Christmas. Epiphany ends on Ash Wednesday, when Lent begins.

Epiphany marks the coming of the Magi, or wise men, to worship the baby Jesus. Because the Magi were Gentiles, Epiphany symbolizes the first recognition of Christ by non-Jews. It's a reminder that Christ came as the light — and Savior — of the whole world.


The traditional color for Epiphany is green, indicating life, growth, hope and eternity. Symbols for the season include a light, candle or star; a crown or three crowns; three gifts; and a globe. In the modern church, Epiphany has become a time to focus on reaching out and “showing” Jesus as the Savior of all people. It's also a reminder to engage in Christian community and to heal divisions among God's children with **His Word**.

His Word is our focus as Christians. In John 1:1 we read that Jesus Christ is God's Word in the flesh. Here at Faith we need to trust completely in **God's Word**, whether in the flesh or in the Bible.

As we observe Epiphany we read about a perfect example of leaning on God's Word for guidance. It's important for us to realize that when God guided the Magi to the new-born King, He didn't guide them directly to Bethlehem, but instead He led them to Jerusalem, and even more specifically, He led them to His Word.

In looking for this promised Messiah, the temple leaders in Herod's palace turned to God's Word in the book of Micah, which then lead them to the little town of Bethlehem. The point is, God wanted them to see that His Word would bring the answer. In the new year, we may well learn more and more to trust His Word, which brings healing, as we read from Ps. 107:20: “God sent out His Word and healed them.” Each of us has need of “healing” in so many ways. At such occasions it's our human nature to turn to our family, friends, or perhaps even the world wide web. We all have someone who will offer guidance and give encouragement, or as Google advertises, it can HELP in any way. But only **God's Word** is infallible and is always sufficient for our needs.

This year join us as we celebrate Epiphany on January 6 with the Lord's Supper. Share this good news with others as God has shared it with the gentiles, as well as Israel.



Council News: The Treasurer reported the general fund balance is \$27,837.92; Designated Fund balance is \$19,925.03. The new furnace has been installed at a cost of \$12,889, and the bill has been paid. Monies from the 2018 Oktoberfest profits and designated Memorial Funds will be used to cover this expense.

The Voters' Assembly will be January 6th to approve the 2019 budget and elect officers. Also, the congregation will have the opportunity to nominate names for the offices of President and 1st Vice-President positions of the LCMS to be elected at the International Convention next summer.

Council raised the cleaning lady's salary from \$10 an hour to \$15 an hour. A 4% increase in Pastor's salary and an increase in organ playing fee was recommended for the new budget. Replacement parts have been received to install in two toilet units in the women's restrooms. Wi-Fi service at church has been terminated.

On February 3rd we will have the Vicar Blanken from Holy Cross, Moline, filling in for the church service.

CID-Church Extension Fund has decided to revised our loan agreement to increased of our loan interest to 5% with a new monthly payment of \$2,095. Council recommends continuing to submit our current payment of \$3,156.46.

Next meeting will be Tuesday evening, February 19th, at 7:00 PM.


