My Dad: "My dad is stronger than your dad!" 12 year old Thomas said to his friends. An argument ensued regarding whose dad was strongest, richest, smartest, etc. Then the children began bragging about the important people their fathers knew. "My dad knows the mayor," one boy bragged. Another chimed in, "My dad knows a U.S. senator!" A third boy said, "My dad knows the governor!" Thomas didn't think his dad knew any important people. He didn't know what to say. Then he remembered that his dad would bring his mom and his two sisters to church every Sunday. His dad would often help with the worship service and sometimes remained afterwards to speak with the pastor. Thomas blurted out proudly, "My dad knows God!" The other boys were silent.

Many people claim to know about God. But not nearly as many truly know God. To know about God means little. James 2:19 tells us that the devil knows that much! To know God is to know Him as our Father and creator, and to rejoice that He knows us. To know God is to praise and honor him with our words and our actions. Points to Ponder: 2 Timothy 3:1-7 But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. ² For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³ heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, ⁴ treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵ having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. ⁶ For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions, ⁷ always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth.

St. Paul nailed it on the head when he penned these words to Timothy, and they apply so true in our worldly society and culture today. Just listen to the news, tune into social media platforms, and look around in our community of Kewanee this month. On June tenth in our own backyard, Northeast Park, there will be the Kewanee PRIDE fest. Billed as a "true family-friendly event" it will include several Drag shows intermixed with children story time shows. Now those who disagree with this and every other aspect of the sexual revolution and the LGBTQIA+ "rainbow" are not merely asked to condone it; rather, we are being compelled to celebrate and support it. "Our vision is to empower each individual in attendance to feel they are able to express themselves" is their statement." 
Friends: Lacey Hammons, Jim Tudder, the citizens of oppressed Ukraine, and all military personnel and first responders.

Council Notes: The treasurer's report was distributed and Sue reported that the general fund has \$53,672.31 the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$14,315.47 for a total of \$67,987.78. The church extension fund balance is \$148,793.40. Sue identified the other income in April to include the insurance payment of \$6,756.34 and \$1,781.00 from Thrivent member investments.

The elevator repairs are completed, and now waiting on state inspector to return. Ted is having trouble finding a contractor to bid on siding repairs.

Bill presented a booklet of study that helps family members and Elders learn how to approach and counsel inactive members of all ages to get them back to attending church. Pastor will review this training tool.

Women Of Faith will be gathering components and putting together LWR **Personal Care Kits** in June and July. Faith members are asked to donate <u>new</u> items for these kits.

Each kit will consist of: 1-medium light-weight bath towel (20x 40 minimum), 2-bars of bath size soap (9oz.)wrapped, 1-adult size toothbrush in package, 1-sturdy comb, and 1-metal nail clipper.

Q. What is the role of elders in a congregation?

A. What we commonly call "elders" in the LCMS are laypersons appointed to serve a congregation in various ways, in keeping with its constitution and bylaws. As a humanly defined office, the term elder itself does not have a uniform meaning throughout The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod.

Elders (or deacons) typically support and assist the pastor in his spiritual and administrative tasks toward the goal of nurturing and strengthening the spiritual life, mission, and ministry of the congregation. Some congregations prefer the term "deacon" to refer to laymen with similar duties.

Elders may pray with and for the pastor, advise the pastor in certain decisions of pastoral care, help to evaluate and encourage his performance in his pastoral and administrative duties, assist him in visitations and in the distribution of the Lord's Supper, and advocate for the pastor's and his family's material, emotional, and spiritual well-being.
