On the last day of the feast, the great day, Jesus stood up and cried out, "If anyone thirsts, let him come to me and drink. Whoever believes in me, as the Scripture has said, 'Out of his heart will flow rivers of living water.'" Now this He said about the Spirit, whom those who believed in Him were to receive, for as yet the Spirit had not been given, because Jesus was not yet glorified. John 7:37-39

Jesus spoke these words at the Temple during the Jewish festival of the Tabernacle, the O.T. celebration of God preserving His people by providing water for them while traveling in the Wilderness. Fifty days after His resurrection and ten days after His Ascension, that's exactly what did happen! As instructed by Jesus, the apostles had gathered themselves in Jerusalem to wait and pray. They were an assortment of unimpressive, unemployed out-of-towners. Suddenly, a sound like the rushing of a great wind, filled the whole house where they were staying. Tongues of fire appeared on them. The Holy Spirit came upon them in power and strength, filling each of them, and they all began to speak in other languages. The miraculous ability to speak in different tongues equipped the apostles for communicating with the visitors staying in Jerusalem for the Festival of Weeks. That day, and the days that followed, saw thousands converted to the Christian faith and to responsible church membership. (Acts 2:1-4)

The miracle of Pentecost is not merely a past historical event. The Spirit's wondrous activity goes on in the Church today. Keeping our faith and hope becomes ever more difficult these days as Christianity and conservative Christians become, the object of ridicule, mockery, and even suspicion. Many Christian congregations have, or can become apathetic and complacent. When we struggle with fear and doubt, the Holy Spirit invites us to pray for comfort and hope. Our Helper does not give us over to discouragement, but strengthens us in our faith. He reminds us that Christ, our Savior from sin and death, holds us firmly in His undying grip, and helps us hold firmly to Him. The Spirit does not give us over to uncertainty, but consoles us, confirming in us the belief that God's Word is true and His promises sure. The Spirit gives us joy in the midst of grief and peace in the face of fear.

The Holy Spirit, active in the apostles on that first Pentecost, is the same Spirit who works in believers today. The dynamic Word proclaimed on Pentecost, the Gospel of Jesus Christ, crucified and risen from the dead, is the same Word proclaimed among us today. The Spirit unites believers through the bond of peace. Just like an artesian well that flows constantly with cold, pure, wonderful water, God fills us to overflowing with His Holy Spirit. Like the apostles on Pentecost, our courage and confidence in witnessing and telling others about Christ lie in the power of the Spirit and the Word. Christians need not only be aware of our sinful condition and need of a Savior, but we require hearing His Word recurrently to learn how to be His disciples and practicing followers of Christ Himself. May His "living water" refresh you daily as we gather to hear the Word and Sacrament, and pray for our congregation and the Church at large.

Spring Storm: On March 31, a tornado tore across the north side of Kewanee damaging buildings and felling trees. Our building and shed received damage including roof shingles blown off, siding broken and torn off, and metal fascia ripped away off our shed. (See picture on page 4) Power was off for almost a day prompting the cancellation of the Palm Sunday brunch plans, but normal Sunday worship was held. An insurance adjuster was called and a check has been received to cover repairs less \$1000 deductible. Temporary coverings were installed on the roof until the shingles can be replaced. There was significant damages to trees and homes adjacent to the church property.

We thank our Lord for protecting His house in this event, and pray for His blessings as we move forward in restoration of our buildings.


