"Thank the Lord and sing His praise; tell everyone what He has done Let all who seek the Lord rejoice and proudly bear His name. He recalls His promises and leads His people forth in joy With shouts of thanksgiving. Alleluia, alleluia."

We sing the above portion of the liturgy in Divine Service Settings one and two as the Post-Communion Canticle. It is most appropriate that we do praise and thank God for this gift. At this time of the year Americans set aside a designated day for giving thanks. For what we enjoyed during the year, and for what we enjoyed only for a time, Christians should thank God continually.

Usually, we thank God for our blessings during worship, at mealtime, and sometimes before sleep or as we awake. Luther reminds us in the fourth petition of the Lord's Prayer that God gives us everything we need to support ourselves including food, clothing, housing, family, weather, peace, friends. "*The eyes of all look to you, and you give them their food in due season. You open your hand; you satisfy the desire of every living thing.*" (Psalm 145:15-16) Martin Luther recognized God's blessings to every living thing when he wrote about the First Article of the Apostles' Creed in the Large Catechism. There he wrote, "Hence, since every-thing we possess, and everything in heaven and on earth besides, is daily given and sustained by God, it inevitably follows that we are in duty bound to love, praise, and thank Him without ceasing, and, in short, to devote all these things to His service." (The Book of Concord, Fortress Press, 1959, page 412)

God also gives us spiritual gifts such as: the Sacraments, His Holy Word, the Holy Spirit, and faithful pastors. As you read the canticle above do you see something else God gives us? He always keeps His promises. Not just to His chosen Israel, but also today to all believers, His children through Baptism. In our LifeLight study of Joshua we find God at work keeping His covenant with Abraham and His nation Israel as He leads them into the promised land of Canaan giving victory over their enemies. What He promises, He will do. He does not forget or fail to keep His promises the way we often do. The Book of Joshua demonstrates to us most convincingly of the Lord's absolute faithfulness in fulfilling His promises through Jesus Christ. God chose Joshua as His agent to give the His people the "Promised Land." He chose His only Son as an earthly agent to gain for us a "Promise Land" of eternal rest in Heaven.

God promises to forgive us our sins through His mercy for Christ's sake, and releases us from these burdens in life. "In Him we have redemption through his blood, the **forgiveness** of our trespasses, according to the riches of His grace," (Ephesians 1:7) Also, God promises never to forsake us. "But you, O Lord, are a God merciful and gracious, slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love and **faithfulness**." (Psalm 86:15) God will al-

ways remember you. Neither will He forget His promise to raise us and all believers on the Day of Judgement. "But in fact Christ has been raised from the dead, the firstfruits of those who have fallen asleep. For as by a man came death, by a man has come also the resurrection of the dead. For as in Adam all die, so also in Christ shall all be made alive." (1 Corinthians 15:20-22)

At this time of Thanksgiving, let us not forget to give thanks to God who remembers His promises to us through Christ Jesus.



Church Council Report: The treasurer reported that the General Fund balance is \$50,537.87, the Memorial/ Dedicated Fund is \$15,340.51 for a total of \$65,878.38. The Church Extension Fund Balance is \$160,368.50. \$1055 has been received in memorials for Wendell Hier.

A state elevator inspection has been completed by Otis Elevator and Stuard & Associates. Inspection failed because an emergency light battery is dead, and the phone did not work. Additionally, a cylinder gasket is leaking and should be replaced. Five gallons of oil were added for now. Council approved an estimate for repairs sent by Otis for \$5,868.00 along with the contract agreement. Half of the cost must be included with the signed agreement to schedule the work. An invoice for \$220 from Stuard was received for inspection services. The elevator will have to be inspected again once repairs are completed. Bill is checking with insurance to see if it will help with expenses.

A new cleaning person, Senna Israel, will begin shortly cleaning the upstairs areas.

Council has agreed to accept from Norma Emerson, Wendell Hier's sister, a ceramic nativity set, in Wendell's honor.

Q: Why do some churches take a weak position on abortion?

A: God's Fifth Commandment is clear, "You shall not murder." God forbids us to take the life of another person, and this most certainly includes abortion. Abortion is an emotional issue and one that is very upsetting to many. It is easier for a church to take a weak position and not speak out clearly against abortion. However, a church body that wishes to be faithful to the Scriptures cannot remain silent, but must clearly indicate that willful abortions are sinful. Many mainline, liberal denominations, which tolerate doubt and indifference in their churches about many teachings of the Bible, also tolerate and even defend abortion. It is often confusing to Missouri Synod Lutherans when they hear that some other Lutheran churches have not taken a strong stand again abortion. It is important for us to make clear that our church does not share the position of those church bodies that do not speak clearly against the sin of abortion. -Dr. A. L.
