**Uplifted Hands**: Moses' hands grew weary, so they took a stone and put it under him, and he sat on it, while Aaron and Hur held up his hands, one on one side, and the other on the other side. So his hands were steady until the going down of the sun. And Joshua overwhelmed Amalek and his people with the sword. Exodus 17:12-13

Life can sometimes feel like a battle. This is true especially for Christians who are trying to honor the Lord by serving others and by proclaiming the Gospel. This is also true for pastors and other professional ministers in our Lutheran churches and schools. The world considers Christians to be intolerant, narrow minded, and out of touch with reality. We can become weary from always "swimming upstream" against the currents of popular opinion and world philosophies.

It is important to remember that Jesus already fought and won the battle against sin and the devil. All we must do is stand (Eph.6). The devil cannot harm us. In Exodus 17, we see the account of when Aaron and Hur stood with Moses while Moses blessed the people of Israel as they fought against the army of Amalek. As long as Moses held his hands up in blessing, the Israelites were winning. If he lowered his hands, they began to lose. So Aaron and Hur stood beside Moses and held up his hands.

Are there any "Aarons" and "Hurs" in your congregation? If so, praise God and thank them for their service. If you are an Aaron or a Hur, never forget how important you are! 



Trustees reported that the roof leak has been repaired, several shingles replaced, and caulking replaced on the west flat roof section at a cost of \$1680 by Triple J Construction. Other minor maintenance was preformed, but the women's toilet in the lower level is leaking again. Thanks to the Leezers a new color copier has been purchased and installed in the church office.

An Oktoberfest date of October 14th was established, and council is requesting ideas to use funds generated by the dinner. Council approved the purchase of a new office chair for Pastor Weber as his chair seat is crumbling.
