Women of Faith: The ladies will be meeting on Thursday, **September 8th**, at 10:00AM to work on the final preparations for R.I. Zone Fall Rally.

Rev. Dr. Roosevelt Gray, Director of Black and African Missions, LCMS, commented: "Years of prayerful planning and faithful preaching led the congregation to establish St. Paul Christian Academy, the only Lutheran Christian Academy serving this historic Oak Cliff community and the lone African American congregation in the Texas District with a Lutheran Christian Academy." It will allow the congrega-




tion to serve more children and to add on-site and online classes for young adults and parents in academic subjects, health, and fitness, as well as Bible studies and classes for new Christians. Thank you for your prayers and support of this Mission Grant, The Littlest and Least of These.

The LWML ladies are collecting used **postage stamps**, **empty prescription bottles**, **old Portals of Prayers books and Bibles**. Collection boxes for these items are in the Narthex.

"Light Up the World with Christ" is the theme for the Rock Island Zone Fall Rally on September 20th being hosted by Faith's WOF ladies.

This year's theme is "Light Up the World with Christ" based on Psalm 119:105. Our guest speaker is Rev. Rodney G. Blomquist, CID Prison/Jail coordinator and a member of District's Human Care Committee. Retired, he is currently serving as vacancy pastor at Trinity Lutheran, Taylorville, IL.



Registration/coffee time begins at 8:30 am and the rally will start at 9:15 am.

Masking will not be required, but is optional by each individual. Masks are available at the church. A lunch is included with the registration fee of \$12.00 per person. Names of attendees and fees shall be given to Mary Hahn by Thursday, September 8th. Sixty attendees are anticipated. Thank you to all those volunteers that are working with our ladies to make this event successful.

Youth Catechesis Class: Pastor Weber is making plans to begin a Catechism class for the youth of Faith in September. This two year program will meet on selected weekends preparing them for Confirmation. If you have or know of a student (5th-8th) who would benefit from this class, contact Pastor for more information.

Cleaning Day Scheduled: September 17th has been scheduled for a general total church cleaning day in preparation for the LWML Fall Rally at Faith. Many hands are needed to cleanse the main floor as well as the lower level and classrooms. Bring your favorite cleaning utensils if you desire.

Church Council Report: The treasurer reported as of 8/16/2022 the General Fund balance was \$50,010.02 and the Memoria/Dedicated Fund balance was \$13,048.81. The current mortgage amount is \$163,214.30. It was announced that CID-CEF has raised the interest rate on loans from 4.5 to 5.0%, but reduced our minimum monthly payment (\$1896.54). Council directed the treasurer to continue to pay \$2100 per month as funds allow.

At the CID Convention, in addition to Rev. Michal Mohr being elected as CID President, Rev. Mark Eddy (Zion, Taylor Ridge) was elected as 1st. Vice President, and Rev. Kent Umbarger (St. John, E. Moline) was elected as Secretary. This requires R.I. Circuit to select a replacement for the Circuit Visitor position. The next CID Pastor's Conference will be held at St. John's, East Moline on October 2nd-5th.

Council approved a special door collection to assist Holy Trinity, Bristol, Tennessee, who found their building program hit a snag when the city required an additional larger culvert installation at a cost of \$50,000 not covered in their CEF loan. This small congregation has a go-fund me site at https://gofund.me/89bb7ed0.

2022 Oktoberfest has been scheduled for Thursday, October 13th. An organization meeting will be setup later in September. Proceeds to be split between our mortgage and Concordia Lutheran Academy in Geneseo, IL.

Council approved an expenditure from the dedicated military fund to purchase copies of a book, <u>"Five Love Languages"</u> by Gary Chapman for use in the chaplain's program on relationships. Also, Pastor will present a Bible Study on this topic in the future.

Q: Where did angels come from? Were they created in heaven? Can a mortal be made an archangel?

A: Angels are created beings. Genesis doesn't say exactly when, but it's safe to say it was sometime between Day 1—when it all got started and Day 6 when it all got done. Angels are not animals, and they are not human. They are spiritual, not physical (Heb. 1:7). The true answer to the question is that we do not know how God made archangels or other angels, but it is clear that mortals do not become angels. The visions of heaven in the book of Revelation make a clear distinction between humans raised from the dead and the angels who populate the halls of heaven. Instead, as creatures made in God's image, dignified beyond measure by the incarnate Son, we will dwell in God's eternal presence as the human beings He originally designed us to be.
