**Born Under the Law:** "But when the fullness of time had come, God sent forth his Son, born of woman, born under the law," Galatians 4:4

In the above Bible passage St. Paul tells us that our Savior Jesus born in Bethlehem was "born under the law," referring to the Law of Moses. God emphasizes His Son's humanity in this verse. To be under something means to be a subordinate, to be subject to someone or something. For example the subordinate soldiers follow their commander's orders without hesitation, or slaves were to be subordinate to their masters. Paul wrote earlier, "Now before faith came, we were held captive under the law, imprisoned until the coming faith would be revealed."

These are somber words which remind us, because of God's Law there was no freedom. The law has the words "Thou shall and you must." The law also prohibits other actions. God's law requires complete obedience and will not tolerate disobedience or any excuses. It threatens and condemns. In Galatians 3:10 we read, "Cursed be everyone who does not abide by all things written in the Book of the Law, and do them." As sinners, by nature, we were cursed and doomed to eternal death.

But God had a plan for our salvation. God sent His Son and placed Him under the law. The Lord of the law became a subject to the demands and requirements of the law for us.

The first public indication of Jesus' subjection to the law for us came when He was just eight days old. The circumcision of Jesus is an event from the life of Jesus, according to the Gospel of Luke chapter 2:21, "And at the end of eight days, when He was circumcised, He was called Jesus, the name given by the angel before he was conceived in the womb." On that day, when He officially received His name Jesus, meaning "Savior," He was circumcised according to the law in Leviticus 12:3, "And on the eighth day the flesh of his foreskin shall be circumcised." Jesus saved us by keeping God's law in perfect obedience for us as true man, and later by dying on the cross as the ultimate sacrifice for our sins. At the time of His crucifixion God, the Father, laid the entire burden of the sins of the world upon His head.



A Christian who repents and receives forgiveness of sin through the blood of Christ does not have to keep the Old Testament ceremonial laws either. When one repents from sin, has faith in the sacrifice of Jesus Christ and is baptized, he receives complete and total forgiveness of any and all sins. This is why it was so important that our Savior had to be born under the law.

Heavenly Father, we confess that we are not capable of keeping your law. We deserve your everlasting punishment. Therefore, we praise and thank you for sending your Son to be born under the law to obey your law in our place. Amen

May your life be blessed as you see God bring forth new things in the coming year!



Welcome to Kewanee: On December 22nd St. Paul's Lutheran installed their new pastor. He is Rev. Winston Grieser. He comes from a congregation in Moses Lake, Washington in the English District with a wife and four young children. He is also a Chaplin in the Indiana National Guard. CID President Mohr conducted the installation. They are currently searching for a new home in Kewanee. We welcome him and his family to town, and thank God for providing a shepherd for this congregation of believers.

Church Council Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and Sue reported that the general fund has \$51,771.93, the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$15,564.32 for a total of \$67,336.25. The church extension fund balance is \$116,285.51. An additional payment was made CID-CEF because we received \$1000 gifts from two families toward our mortgage balance. We thank them for their generosity.



Pastor informed the Council concerning St. Paul's new pastor. He has had a phone conversation with him.

Faith received a letter from LLC Telecom Services, Rosemont, IL inquiring if we would be open to leasing an 100' X 100' parcel of our property for the installation of a communications tower. Gary has attempted to secure more information, but as of this meeting date he has not heard back.

A 2025 budget of \$81,463 was approved for recommendation to the voters on January 12th. New names for the Council positions are still requested.

Removal of Christmas adornments is scheduled for Saturday, January 11th starting at 9:00 AM. A new vacuum sweeper has been purchased for the church.

Council approved a special collection for CID's Camp CILCA to show support and give thanks for its 75 years anniversary in 2025.

CID News: Congregations of the Central Illinois District will gather in convention at the Crowne Plaza Hotel in Springfield on July 13-15, 2025, under the theme "Witnessing Christ to the People." Any member of a CID congregation may nominate a pastor, commissioned worker, or layperson for one of the 28 positions to be elected at the convention. Q: Rev. Grieser, St. Paul's, comes from a LCMS church in the English District. What is the English District?

**A:** The English District is one of the two non-geographic districts of 35 districts of The Lutheran Church-Missouri Synod. It's inception can be traced to colonial times. When the district was formally organized in 1888, there were few parishes in the Missouri Synod which used English. Thus English is a historic name. Today there are 161 congregations, 6 new mission starts, 5 campus ministries, one human care ministry, 67 schools in the Canadian province of Ontario and in 22 states, crossing 4 time zones, and employing 23 different languages for worship of the Lord and Bible study. Membership currently consists of approximately 56,000 baptized members and 44,000 communicant members. The English District's vision is to ignite Christ's Church in Mission by serving communities, connecting with the unchurched and de-churched, growing in faith and numbers, and reproducing through the planting of new churches.
