"The Singing Church" : Lutherans have historically been called "the singing church." There is no doubt that music has been a major component in the theology and practice of the Lutheran church. Luther once remarked about music, "We can mention only one point, namely, that next to the Word of God, music deserves the highest praise." Music has a power and purpose that cannot be understated in our worship and the life of the congregation.

But music does more than touch the emotions. Music is a vehicle that carries both the musician and the hearer deeper into connection with the truth of the Scriptures. This is true of the most complex Bach chorale and even the simplest of songs like "Jesus Loves Me, This I Know." Each musical selection within the church shapes the thoughts, minds and faith of the people who experience them.

This is also true of stewardship hymns. We are currently considering the verses of "Forgive Us, Lord, for Shallow Thankfulness" (LSB 788) as it shapes our understanding and practice of stewardship. This month we take a deeper dive into verse two:

"Teach us to thank you, Lord, for love and grace For life and vision, for a purpose clear, For Christ Your Son, and for each human face that shows Your message ever new and near."

The stanza begins by touching on the truth of the Law. Thankfulness is not a natural posture for fallen humanity. For sinners fixed upon themselves, thankfulness for love and grace is something that must be taught. We are those who hoard and clutch. Our confession of our shallow thankfulness highlights the need for us to learn thankfulness to God.

Thankfulness also points to what we are stewards of: love and grace! All the things we have traditionally called stewardship aren't actual stewardship. Rather, what matters is how we steward the one, true and only treasure: the love and grace of God revealed to us in the Gospel of Jesus Christ. So, all stewardship is stewardship of the Gospel! How can we gaze at the cross and empty tomb and not be thankful?

The LCMS defines stewardship as "the free and joyous activity of God's family — the church — in managing life's resources for His purposes." God's love and mercy give us a clear purpose as we live out our Baptism and practice this joyous stewardship. All we are, all we have entrusted to us, and all we are called to do is to connect others with the love and mercy of God revealed in Jesus!

The faithful steward sings with lips and life of this love and mercy that is ever new and near. In the Scriptures. In the Lord's House. At the Lord's Table. This is where our stewardship song starts and ends. Our family, our co-workers and classmates, and our world need to hear this song!

Faith That Shines Through In The Culture - Hall Of Tyrannus 2024: A seminar is hosted by Christ Lutheran Church, 311 Hersey Road, Normal, IL and presented by Rev. Alfonso Espinosa on Saturday, October 9, 2024. Program runs from 10:00 am to 4:00 pm. Cost is \$15.00 per person and includes refreshments and lunch. Dr. Alfonso Espinosa, is senior pastor at Saint Paul's Lutheran Church in Irvine, CA and author of books, "Faith That Sees Through The Culture" (2018), "Faith That Engages the Culture" (2021), and "Faith That Shines In The Culture" (2023) (this seminar will be based around the latter book of the same name).

Church Council Report: The treasurer's report was distributed and Sue reported that the general fund has \$54,714.44 the Memorial/Dedicated Fund has \$14,609.57 for a total of \$69,624.01. The church extension fund balance is \$121,196.76. Sue informed that the new speaker system bill was paid out of the memorial fund with the designated money from the Godke's.

Pastor Weber informed us that Rev. Gary Wright from Zion- Hampton has received a call for a vacancy in Southern Illinois and is prayerfully in consideration. Pastor Weber continues his home visits and also intends to make a visit to the vacancy Pastor at St. Paul's.

A motion was approved for the Oktoberfest proceeds to be designated as follows: seminary student Joshua Beiri - \$500.00 and the Lutheran Confessional Church of Pakistan mission \$500.00, with the balance to be applied to the general fund for repairs.

Trustees will be reviewing the ceiling problem on the north side of the Nave to determine a resolution and get estimates for repairs.

Council approved a door donation be taken to assist the Zion-Taylor Ridge congregation with an angel tree program for the *Prison Fellowship Ministries*. Prisoners sign up in summer with the chaplain at their prison for churches to purchase a Christmas present. Zion has 20 children's names to purchase \$25.00 gifts each. A collection will be taken on Sept. 21st and 29th. Rev. Eddy and Zion will be responsible for purchasing, wrapping, and delivering the presents.

Reformation Day Thoughts: "For by works of the law no human being will be justified in His sight, since through the law comes knowledge of sin." Q: Has The Lutheran Church Missouri Synod said anything officially on the celebration of Halloween?

A: The LCMS has not officially spoken to the observance of Halloween in any of its resolutions or statements. Opinions differ in our church regarding the appropriateness of Christians observing Halloween customs. On the one hand, we do not want to minimize the potential dangers of involvement with occultic symbols and practices. At the same time, we do not want to lay a burden of conscience on others in matters that lie in the area of Christian freedom and sound Christian judgment.
